

National Awareness Campaign on Energy Conservation Proposed Methodology for Painting Competition – 2022

1. Introduction

The Minister of Power, Government of India undertakes awareness campaign on energy conservation on pan India basis. Painting Competition for students has been included as one of the activities of the campaign, which would not only make aware the students about the need of conserving energy but at the same time would educate and involve their parents as well in the above cause. With the im to infuse fresh blood in the ongoing program of Painting Competition on Energy Conservation, redesigned methodology is being introduce from current year i.e., 2022. Children studying from 5th class/standard to 10th class/standard would participate in the painting competition, an identified activity to benefit the nation in creating awareness amongst pomestic Sector.

With the advent of COVID Pandemic from the recent past and the prevalent "New Normal" situation, a new scheme with a facelift with a tinge of international level participation would be implemented throughout the country with the active support of 11 Central Public Sector Undertakings (CPSUs') working under the administrative control of the Ministry of Power – Government of India and all the 37 State Designated Agencies (SDAs') established under the Energy Conservation Act 2001.

The details of proposed scheme are as follows:

2. Eligibility Criteria

- I. For Indian Schools
 - a. Schools situated in India and having affiliation with the any of the education board like Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), Council for the Indian School Certificate Examination (CISCE), State Boards of all States in India are eligible to participate in Painting Competition.
 - b. Affiliated schools which get registered themselves on Bureau of Energy
 Efficiency's (BEE) portal <u>www.bee-studentsaward.in</u> can participate in the Painting competition.
 - c. Students of 5th 6th & 7th class/standard are eligible to participate in **Group**
 - d. Students of 8th 9th & 10th class/standard are eligible to participate in Group 'B'.

For Individual from India 11.

- a. Children Studying in 5th 6th & 7th class/standard in affiliated schools are eligible to participate in Group 'A' as individual entry.
- b. Children Studying in 8th 9th & 10th class/standard in affiliated schools are eligible to participate in Group 'B' as individual entry.
- c. Individuals, who submit self-declaration in the prescribed manners while registering themselves on Bureau of Energy Efficiency's (BEE) portal www.bee-studentsaward.in are eligible to participate in the Painting Competition.

For Schools of other countries (situated outside india) 111.

- a. Schools of countries other than India and having affiliation with the any of the education board like Central Board of Sandary Education (CBSE), Council for the Indian School Certificate Examination (CISCE) are eligible to participate in Painting Competition.
- b. Schools of other countries would be required to register themselves on Bureau of Energy Efficiency's (BEE) portal www.bes studentsaward.in . to participate in the Painting competition.
- c. Students of 5th 6th & 7th class/standard are eligible to participate in Group 'A'.
- d. Students of 8th 9th & 10th class/standard are eligible to participate in Group 'B'.

3. Methodology of Painting Competition

The Painting Competition would be held in three stages namely School, State and National Level. In order to secure maximum participation, the School Level competition is proposed to be organized starting from (from month to month). The salient features of the Methodologies and Responsibilities are presented in the subsequent sections.

School Level Painting Competition

For Indian Schools

- a. BEE would nominate Nodal Officials for all the 37 States and UTs'.
- b. BEE would design advertisement creative and Nodal Agencies would release in National Dailies for launch of activity in all the 37 States/UTs.
- c. Nodal Officials of all the States and UTs' would run a media campaign to spread awareness about Painting Competition amid society.

- Evaluation Committee would select only 2 best paintings of each group and would hand over to Nodal School management.
- k. Nodal School would share these two best paintings with State Nodal Official via email unless otherwise prescribed.
- No correspondence/grievance will be entertained by the Nodal School and the decision of selecting two best paintings by the School Evaluation Committee would be final.

For Schools of other countries (situated outside India)

- a. Bureau of Energy Efficiency would request Chairman of CBSE to nominate officials to coordinate the activities
- b. Bureau of Energy Efficiency would request nominated officials of CBSE to write an official email to all the affiliated schools situated outside India as well as in India to organize Painting Competition in their schools during from month to month.
- A brief methodology of the Painting Competition would also be shared with these schools.
- d. It would be mandatory for CBSE to nominate a Senior Official for overall supervision of actions and support with BEE and MoP.
- Designed and focussed Emailers may also be sent by BEE/MoP to schools to inform them on Painting Competition.
- f. CBSE Schools situated in foreign countries must register themselves on BEE Portal <u>www.bee-studentsaward.in</u> and organize 2 hours Painting Competition in their respective schools for **Group 'A'** and **Group 'B'** separately in a competitive manner during (from month to month).
- g. All the participants would carry their own drawing material unless otherwise provided by the school.
- h. Evaluation Committee of the respective schools to select only 2 best paintings from each group and upload them on BEE portal in the prescribed manners.
- No correspondence/grievance will be entertained by the MoP/BEE/CBSE regarding the School level Competition and the decision of selecting two best paintings by the School Evaluation Committee would be final.

II. State Level Painting Competition

- For Indian Schools and Individuals
- a. 2 best paintings of Group 'A' received from various schools of respective State/UT would be further evaluated by the State Evaluation Committee duly constituted by Nodal Official in consultation with State Education Department.

- d. Nodal Official of all States and UTs would organize one or many meets with State Education Officials and apprise them about methodology of Painting Competition.
- e. BEE would design Emailers and share with Nodal Officials to use them to inform schools on Painting Competition.
- f. Schools, which have registered on BEE Portal <u>www.bee-studentsaward.in</u>, would organize 2 hours Painting Competition in their respective schools for **Group 'A'** and **Group 'B'** separately in a competitive manner during (from month to month).
- g. All the participants would use their own drawing material unless otherwise provided by the school.
- Evaluation Committee of the respective schools would select only 2 best paintings from each group and would upload them on BEE portal in the prescribed manners.
- No correspondence/grievance will be entertained by the MoP/BEE/CPSU regarding the School level Competition and the decision of selecting two best paintings by the School Evaluation Committee would be final.

For Individual Participants (Indian Schools)

- a. Nodal Official of respective State/UT would short list 4 5 Nodal Schools in major/prime cities in consultation with District Education Officer/State Education Department.
- Nodal schools would, preferably, be declared as venue for the Painting Competition for individual participants of respective State/UT.
- Staff of the Nodal School would perform the duty of Invigilator for the organization of 2 hours Painting Competition.
- d. Nodal School, in consultation with Nodal Official, would constitute Evaluation Committee under the supervision of the official from State Education Department.
- e. Evaluation Committee members and Invigilators would be paid honorarium in the prescribed manners.
- f. Individuals who get registered on BEE portal <u>www.bee-studentsaward.in</u> to participate in Painting Competition and have met all essential parameters would be sent admission ticket and venue details along with instructions via email and WhatsApp message.
- g. Painting competition would get cancelled for the declared Venue automatically if there is no registration for such venue (Nodal School).
- Nodal Official would coordinate and facilitate organisation of Painting Competition for individual participants with these Nodal Schools.
- i. All the individual participants must carry their own drawing material.

 There would be no State Level Competition for Schools of other countries (situated outside India).

III. National Level Painting Competition

- For Indian Schools and Individuals
- a. The National Level Painting Competition for Group 'A' and 'B' would be held in Delhi in the month of December 2022.
- b. First, Second and Third prize winners of all the State/UT Level Painting Competition of Group 'A' and 'B' would be eligible to participate in National Level Painting Competition.
- c. The National Level Painting Competition of 2 hours duration would be held separately for Group 'A' and 'B'.
- d. The themes of the National Level Painting Competition for both Groups would be approved by the Ministry of Power/BEE and same will be communicated to all the participating students in advance.
- e. All the participants would be provided with the requisite drawing material at the venue, such as:
 - ✓ Any one of: Pencil Colours, Crayons, Water Colours
 - ✓ Drawing paper size (380x510mm) or (15 x 20 inches)
 - ✓ Drawing board, etc.
- f. Participants of the National Level Painting Competition have to indicate following information at the back of Painting either in Hindi or English;

- b. National Evaluated Committee (NEC) duly constituted by the Ministry of Power, Government of India would evaluate those uploaded paintings of various CBSE affiliated schools for each country and for each group as per approved criteria.
- c. Top 3 evaluated paintings for each Group would get eligible to be included for the final evaluation process by National Evaluated Committee along with 108 paintings from schools situated in India.

4. Responsibilities of Coordinating Agencies and Funding

- I. Ministry of Power/ Bureau of Energy Efficiency
 - a. Ministry of Power/BEE would write to all the Central Public Sector units (CPSUs) under its administrative control, to nominate Nodal Officials along with 2 – 3 support staff and Coordinating Officials.
 - Bureau of Energy Efficiency would request Chairman of CBSE to nominate Senior Officials along with 2 – 3 support staff to coordinate activities.
 - c. Ministry of Power and Bureau of Energy Efficiency to convene a joint meeting of all Nominated Nodal and Coordinating Officials of CPSUs' and Representative of CBSE in the month of XXXX, 2022 for assigning the responsibilities to officials, and deciding on the theme topics for School, State and National Level Painting competition.
 - d. The list of CPSUs allocated with the State/Union Territories for organizing the Painting Competition 2022 is at Annexure - 1.
 - The draft advertisement announcing the competition will be prepared by BEE and will be finalized by Ministry of Power/Bureau of Energy Efficiency severally.
 - f. BEE would provide a maximum amount of Rs. 10,00,000/- to each concerned CPSU/PSU for each State/UT towards the cost of procuring mementoes for participants, like LED bulbs, drawing sheets, participation certificates, drawing colours, Advertisement in national/local newspaper, awareness campaign etc.
 - g. BEE would also use social media platform and would encourage all the CPSUs' to use social media to spread awareness on the organization of Painting Competition on Energy Conservation – 2022.
 - For the active support and ensuring improved participation in School Level Painting Competition, the Ministry of Power and Bureau of Energy Efficiency may write to the various Offices by mid of June 2022 such as;
 - State Chief Ministers.
 - ii. Chief Secretaries States

- iii. Principal Secretaries, Energy Department of all States/UTs
- iv. Chief Secretaries State Education Departments etc.
- v. Directors (Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan)
- vi. Chairperson, Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE)
- i. To spread information on School Level Painting Competition, maximum possible Emailers may be sent by Bureau of Energy Efficiency, if required. Nodal Officers are advised to send emailers to schools in their State / UT to the maximum possible.
- j. BEE will advise all State Designated Agencies (SDA) to take up painting competition on energy conservation as part of awareness activity for their respective State/UT and request for their support and cooperation to all Nodal officers in making the event a grand success.
- k. MoP/BEE would depute officials to visit some of the States/UTs (max 05 States/UTs) to visit Education Department or attend meeting organized by Nodal Agency and SDA with BEOs' and DEOs' to support School Level Painting Competition activities.
- I. The Bureau of Energy Efficiency, in consultation with the Ministry of Power, will constitute Groupwise two National Evaluation committee comprising of 5 to 7 renowned persons from the field of Art, drawing teachers for the purpose of adjudging the paintings for Prizes at the National level.
- m. BEE will print certificates with jackets for National Level Painting Competition with the approved design, -. The cost will be borne by the Ministry of Power/BEE.
- n. The Ministry of Power/BEE will also bear the Prize Money at National Level Painting Competition and any other miscellaneous expenditure incurred by BEE in connection with Painting Competition.

II. State Designated Agencies (SDAs)

- a. SDA to support Nodal Agency to convene a meeting in their respective States/UTs at one / multiple places with State Education Department Officials for the launch of Painting Competition.
- SDA to nominate senior official for committee/jury members for selecting paintings.
- c. SDA to support Nodal Agency (CPSU) to organize Award Function at State Level by inviting senior government officials and local media for further impetus to awareness on energy conservation.
- SDA to coordinate with schools and State's Education Departments in order to ensure maximum participation.
- e. SDA would be requested to spread information on School Level Painting Competition,

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respective states to the Bureau.

BEE may write to Head of Education Departme of State/UT for their active role in School Level Painting Competition or which designated Nodal Officer will provide detailed contact information to BEE.

Nodal Officers to visit Education Department of the respective State/UT m. to encourage and request them to issue circula of all the schools for conducting Painting Competition.

Formation of common State/UT Evaluation Common ee comprising of 5 to 7 renowned persons for both Groups from the Teld of Art, drawing teachers, officials from organizers, Officials from SDA, State Government, etc. will be constituted by the I all officials for the selection of 50 best paintings from the total painting received on School Level Painting Competition.

In order to have fair and unbiased results system Nodal officer of the respective State/UT would ensure that State/UT aluation Committee may have at least 50% new jury members in comparison to last year.

The same State/UT Evaluation Committee will a padjudge 13 prize p. winning entries on the basis of Evaluation Criter a (Annexure 02) at State/UT Level competition. The same State/UT aluation Committee will also adjudge 13 prize winning entries on the basis of Evaluation Criteria (Annexure 02) at State/UT Level competent.

For National Level Painting Competition, Air Travel may be permitted for Q. students and guardians from the UTs Andama & Nicobar Islands, Lakshadweep, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Dame Diu, In case of any emergency, the respective nodal officer may do de the travel mode (including air travel) and the expenditure towards the same to be borne by respective coordinating CPSU.

Any other job/responsibility assigned by Ministry of Power / BEE for successful organization of the event.

The proposed CPSU (Power Grid Corporation of Sau Ltd.) selected for organization of National Level Painting Competition for Group 'B' will be responsible to provide budget to cover expension for organization of competition including venue, catering, honorarum amementos for Jury members, Travel, boarding & lodging of Jury members and mementos for 108 selected school students.
- XVIII. Transport arrangements for sight-seeing of self-lited participating of National Level competition of Group 'A' and 'B' along with their guardians to be arranged by the respective Nodal Agency (CPSUs). Accordingly, budget provisions for the same to be arranged by the respective CPSUs.
- XIX. Cost of hiring additional manpower up to 3 persons to assist nominated Nodal Officer in accordance with rules of the concerned CPSU (in case not provided by the concerned CPSU) for the period August 2022 to December 2022.

5. Undertaking by the Participants

- a. The parents / guardian /school principals of the of the State/UT and National level participants and winners would be required to give an undertaking in advance before their students/ward, participate in both the events that the paintings drawn at the State/UT and National Painting competition would be the sole propert of the Ministry of Power.
- b. Further, the Ministry will have the right to use the same for any purpose.
- c. In case of Individual Participation, Parents/Gundians would give undertaking while registering on BEE portal that participants has not or would not participate in painting competition on energy conservation through school.

6. Presentation of Prizes/Awards

Every year, Ministry of Power organizes a function on 14th December to observe the National Energy Conservation Day and resents awards to Industries and other establishments who have made serious efforts to save energy. Nodal officers were requested to make use of 'Get in touch Programme' to raise awareness about National Painting Competition on Energy Conservation 2022. The prize-winning students of the National Level Painting competition will be requested to stay back till 1. The December, 2022

so that they can participate in the National Energy Conservation Day function and receive the prizes from the Chief Guest. The selected prize-winning paintings will also be displayed at the function venue.

Students who have earlier won 1⁸¹/₂ 2nd/₃ 2nd prizes during the last years (2021) within the Group at State Level Painting Competition would not be eligible to participate in the Competition at any level of competition in 2022. However, students who have earlier won consolation prizes during the last year (2021).

- within Group at State level would be eligible to participate in the Painting Competition 2021 but they would not be considered again for the consolation prizes at the State level. They will be considered for prizes, if they win 1st/ 2nd/3nd Prize at the State level.
- ii. The type of materials that can be used are Pencil, Color Pencil, Crayon and Water Color.
- iii. The entry pan be poster or a painting.
- Each individual painting drawn at State/UT and National level will be allotted a number on a pages slip to be pasted on top right corner of paintings
- v. The details of the student mentioned at the back of the paintings at State/UT and National level must be covered with a white paper before exhibiting them for adjudication.
- vi. Use of Callage/Patchwork is not permitted.
- Individual Jury member will have to give marks to paintings on the following points to arrive at limit decision.
- viii. While adjusting the jury will not be shown the details of the participants (given on the back of the drawing sheet) in order to avoid bias or favouritism.
- Ix. The 1st 2st and 3st winner of State/UT level Painting Competition shall not draw 80 % to 100% same painting at National Level and if found so he/she shall stand a chance for elimination for awards.
- x. Preference will be provided, during prize selection, for paintings drawn by students from Government schools in rural areas so that they are able to win at least one prize at different levels. Paintings of such students will be displayed separately for selection.
