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## **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR APPEARING TET-2022:**

Candidates having the following qualification are eligible for appearing in Teacher Eligibility Test-2022.

# A. Minimum Qualification for appearing TET Paper-I:

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and 2-year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known)

or

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 45% marks and 2-year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known), in accordance with NCTE (Recognition Norms and Procedure), Regulations- 2002

or

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and passed 4-years Bachelor of Elementary Education (B.El.Ed.)

or

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and 2-years Diploma in Education (Special Education)

or

Graduation and two-year Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known)

or

Graduation with at least 50% marks and Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.)

or

Post Gradation with a minimum 55% marks or equivalent grade and three-year integrated B.Ed-M.Ed.

N.B: A person who is pursing/admitted to any of the above Teacher Education Courses (e.g. D.El.Ed, B.Ed., B.El.Ed, B.Ed-M.Ed etc) shall be eligible for appearing in the TET Paper-I provided that his/her TET certificate shall be valid only on passing the examination of the aforesaid Teacher Education Courses.

## B. Minimum Qualification for appearing TET Paper-II:

Graduation and 2-years Diploma in Elementary Education (by whatever name known)

or

Graduation with at least 50% marks and 1-year Bachelor in Education (B.Ed).

or

Graduation with at least 45% marks and 1-year Bachelor in Education (B.Ed.), in accordance with NCTE Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations issued from time to time in this regard.

Or

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and 4-year Bachelor in Elementary Education (B.El.Ed.)

or

Senior Secondary (or its equivalent) with at least 50% marks and 4-year B.A / B.Sc.Ed. or B.A. Ed./ B.Sc.Ed. or

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Graduation with at least 50% marks and 1-year B.Ed (Special Education)

or

Post-Graduation with a minimum 55% marks or equivalent grade and three-year integrated B.Ed-M.Ed.

N.B: A person who is pursing/admitted to any of the above Teacher Education Courses (e.g. D.El.Ed, B.Ed., B.El.Ed, B.Ed-M.Ed, etc) shall be eligible for appearing in the TET Paper-II provided that his/her TET certificate shall be valid only on passing the examination of the aforesaid Teacher Education Courses.

#### Notes:

- As notified by NCTE, relaxation up to 5% in the qualifying marks in the minimum Educational Qualification for eligibility shall be allowed to the candidates belonging to reserved categories, such as SC/ST/ OBC/Differently-abled.
- Diploma/Degree Courses in Teacher Education: For the purpose of this notification, a Diploma/Degree Course in teacher education recognized by the National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE) only shall be considered. However, in case of Diploma in Education (Special Education) and B.Ed. (Special Education), a course recognized by the Rehabilitation Council of India (RCI) only shall be considered.
- 3. The minimum qualifications referred above apply to teachers of Languages, Social Studies/Social Science, Mathematics, Science etc. In respect of teachers for Physical Education, the minimum qualification norms for Physical Education Teachers referred to in NCTE Regulation, dated 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2001 (as amended from time to time) shall be applicable. For Teachers of Art Education, Craft Education, Home Science, Work Education, etc. the existing eligibility norms prescribed by the State Governments and other School Managements shall be applicable till such time the NCTE lays down the minimum qualifications in respect of such teachers.
- 4. The candidate should satisfy his/her eligibility before applying and shall be personally responsible in case he/she is not eligible to apply as per the given eligibility criteria. It is to be noted that if a candidate has been allowed to appear in the Teacher Eligibility Test it does not imply that the candidate's eligibility has been verified. It does not vest any right with the candidate for appointment. The eligibility shall be finally verified, by the concerned recruiting agency / appointing authority.
- The Candidates/aspirants who have completed 18 months D.El.Ed Course conducted by NIOS shall be eligible to sit in the TET-2022.
- Minimum percentage of marks in Graduation shall not be applicable to those candidates who had already taken admission to Bachelor of Education or Bachelor in Elementary Education or equivalent courses prior to 29<sup>th</sup> July, 2011.
- The pass mark for TET-2022 is 60% for General Candidates and 50% for OBC, ST, SC and Physically Challenged Candidates.

All questions in TET will be Multiple Choice Questions (MCQs), with four alternatives out of which one answer will be most appropriate. Each carrying one mark and there will be no negative marking.

There will be two papers of TET.

- (i) Paper I will be for a person who intends to be a teacher for classes I to V.
- (ii) Paper II will be for a person who intends to be a teacher for classes VI to VIII.

**Note:** A person who intends to be a teacher for both levels (classes I to V and classes VI to VIII) will have to appear in both the papers (Paper I and Paper II).

Different types of triangles and properties of triangles associated with sides and the angles (Inequalities in triangles) Special points associated with a triangle: circum-center, in center, orthocenter and centroid of a triangle, pedal triangle of a triangle.

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Symmetry and symmetrical figures in a plane; Line of symmetry and reflection. Construction of geometrical figures:

Construction of an angle, the perpendicular bisector of a line segment, construction of a triangle with given sides, the base and the base angles. Solid figures: Solids like sphere, pyramid, cone, prism etc. Mensuration: Area, Volume and problems associated with area, volume and perimeters of plane figures.
